

Specifically, the school board is not involved in day to day operations, but rather focuses on long term planning and budgeting. The school board consists of 5 standing committees (strategic planning, nomination, finance, advancement, and building & grounds) and can appoint ad hoc committees as needed. 5th Grade Experience

The enrollment in the 5th grade has increased. With the encouragement of families to enroll their students at St. Thomas Campus for 5th grade, we began to welcome students. Due to the cancellation of the admissions process for both 5th and 8th grades during the last school year, there was a significant delay in welcoming new families. We have accepted 24 students to the 5th grade and have established a wait list while we search for an additional instructor.

While other Catholic schools have more students in their homeroom classes, some have less. We are right in the middle. With the increased number of charges for Mrs. St Laurent to manage, she will have the assistance of Mrs. Barnett for three days a week. Mrs. Barnett will have the use of the 5A classroom and will focus on strengthening the skills of our students. Her additional time may also be used to support students in the upper school, grades 3 and 4. The 5th grade schedule is being created over the next few days. It will be adjusted to accommodate the needs of individual students and the class.
