After School Clubs, St. Timothy Campus

We are exploring new opportunities for students to engage in clubs after school at St. Timothy. Below please review the information for Esports and Playhouse Theatre Academy. Fees and dates are evolving and will depend upon the interest of our student body. Your opinion and engagement are important for us to move forward.

- St. Timothy Gaming and Esports Club: Señor Valencia and Mr. Brodeur (Rowan) are looking for interested students to engage in an Esports Club. Please see the attached description.
 - The St. Timothy Gaming and Esports Club (STGEC) is an after-school group that provides a welcoming and non-toxic environment in which new and veteran players can explore gaming. Newcomers to the hobby can try beginner-friendly titles that teach basic competencies like controller handling, camera control, and timing. Veteran gamers will have a chance to practice essential competitive skills, such as in-game callouts, team communication, and coordination. Numbers permitting, STGEC will also offer interested participants an opportunity to compete in an intramural tournament over the course of a club session. All club games are family friendly. In its initial sessions, STGEC will be offering play in *Mario Kart 8 Deluxe* and *Super Smash Brothers Ultimate*.
 - In order to ascertain the level of student interest and better determine equipment needs, initial signups for the club will be limited to 8-10 students.
 - Personal Equipment: Students who have their own Nintendo Switch controllers may bring them to campus for use during club time. Additionally, if students are interested in the club after signups are closed, they may reach out to Sr. Valencia or Mr. Brodeur about participating in the initial session provided they are able to bring their own Nintendo Switch system and a copy of one of the offered club titles for use during club time. Titles not offered by the club are not permitted during club sessions.
- Mini-Production: Playhouse on Park, West Hartford, CT Grades 6-8
 - 12 week commitment
 - Meeting once a week for 60-75 minutes
 - In this class students create their own stage performance based on a chosen book or story through improvised play and character creations.
