Reflections on Catholic Education As share by Mrs. Beth Boyle, Co-Director of House of Bread Hartford, Connecticut

One of the many benefits of Catholic education is the constant reminder to 1) Do unto others, 2) Treat others as you want to be treated, and 3) Try and put yourself in someone else's shoes.

In life, we all carry our experiences with us kind of like we carry a backpack. For some of us, we have been and will be fortunate enough to travel, to meet new people, to see new lands and hear new perspectives, to have our eyes opened to the beauty of the world. For some of us, we will experience sadness, trauma, and grief. You will likely not know what anyone's backpack has upon first meeting them or even after knowing them a short while. You may know someone for years and not know what is in their backpack! But I will ask two things of you in your life: 1) Think about your backpack as something that makes you stronger, even when it feels undeniably heavy and you feel crushed by the weight of it. Focus on how these experiences in your backpack are something that makes you stronger. God is always by your side, helping you carry your backpack. 2) Always be mindful of others' backpacks. Assume nothing other than, how can I help them to carry theirs? Always ask, how can I help?

- \* Never underestimate the power of your actions.
- \* People will always remember how you make them feel.
- \* You only really have control over your own choices and responsibilities in this life.

- Xou have the power within yourself to be a helper.
- **X** Be mindful of other people's backpacks.
