Use of technology at St. Thomas and St. Timothy School

No matter which campus you may visit or which classroom you may observe, the goal of the use of technology is to strengthen positive and helpful communication. Teachers use the interactive boards to share curriculum enhancing material. This tool makes areas of the world come alive! Students use iPads and Chromebooks for research, test-taking and preparing longer writing assignments. They are helpful tools in encouraging hesitant students to engage in their learning.

What technology is not, is a tool for harm, negativity and unkindness. Sadly, many people cross the line from respect to disrespect from caring to harassment.

Over the past few weeks, the messaging among our students through social media connections has interfered with our school day. The at-home conversations are impacting the positive and nurturing atmosphere that we seek for our students. Our children are facing verbal assaults through mocking and shaming comments. These episodes of negative communication deeply affect the sense of security, belonging and well-being for our students.

PARENTS AND GUARDIANS, WE NEED YOUR HELP.

Parents and caregivers, it is imperative that you become aware of the use of technology in your home and in your child's social situations. We all know that social media has become a priority for our children. This is their connection to their friends while away from school or their teams. However, the conversations and comments can turn away from the intended purpose of connecting and wishing their friends well.

Please be aware of your child's friendship circles and the exchanges that have taken place. Check the communication history on their devices. Share the need for privacy settings to control the audience of any communication. Control the screen time that you allow at home which when not monitored, turns "Hello, how are you", to gossip and negativity. Each household must make their own choices about the use of technology, but in those choices the end result must be kindness, truth and caring.
